

"He himself granted that some are apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ" -Ephesians 4:11

I've always loved this verse from Ephesians, and in fact the entirety of chapter 4, as Saint Paul wrote about the unity we find through Christ and His Church. But in particular, this oft-quoted verse speaks volumes about the nature of the Church. Some are apostles. Some are prophets. Some are evangelists. Some are pastors. Some are teachers. I think two things are important



here. First, that "some" fill each of these roles. Some implies that there are multiple people for each role, as opposed to one person as "the prophet" or "the pastor." And second, that the roles are distinct, and there is an implication that different folks will fill different roles. No one can do everything. In other words, some might be evangelists, but not prophets. Some might be teachers, but not pastors. Paul's words leave open the possibility of someone filling multiple roles, but most of us will find ourselves really good at one or two of these things, and need the rest of the community to pick up the other roles that we might not be cut out for. Together we can build up the body of Christ in a way that wouldn't be possible if we were on our own.

Using these two ideas, we could expand and adapt Paul's construct to include many of the roles that exist in our modern congregations. Some are singers, some are council members, some are acolytes, some are Sunday School teachers. Just as in Paul's letter, it takes "some" to do all of these things and none of us can do everything.

As I begin paternity leave, I am grateful that this is the Church that Jesus Christ set up. I can be at home attending to our daughter Lydia throughout the week knowing that the work of the Holy Spirit continues through you, the people of God. I am especially grateful for our Council Presidents, Jaime and Sharon, to the other staff members Marsha, Delores, and Kevin, and to Pastor Ken, each of whom will be picking up some tasks for me so that the good things that our (continued on page 3)



27th Annual Rummage and Bake Sale Summary!

WELCA is excited to share the results of our July 2024 Rummage and Bake Sale with the congregation. Our net profit this year was just shy of 2023's net sales by 3%. (2023 was the highest net profit in the history of the sale.) The Rummage Sale and Bake Sale together netted \$5306.00. The Bake Sale averages about 12% of sales – so it is a very important part of the sale. An interesting fact – our credit card sales increased this year to 20% of total sales – another important tool in our organizational tool chest.

In 2024 it took 82 more hours to run the sale from beginning to end. This doesn't include the behind the scenes work of banking, arranging advertising, organizing, planning, sign printing, etc. We visually estimated we had about the same amount of items in both years; however, it took longer to sort through the bags and boxes this year, classify the donations (similar items together), and price them. Thanks to everyone for their donations and bringing in donations from friends and neighbors. We are not as speedy as we used to be – with worker age and energy being a key factor, along with a lot of small items. Several people increased their contributed hours significantly and that was very helpful. Also, a special thank you to two young workers, Jimmy and Johnny, grandsons of Lynn and Carol Whittaker – they worked both days of the sale, helping customers shop and carrying out bags to their cars willingly and with friendly, polite manners! The Bake Sale sold out by mid-morning on Saturday! Thanks to everyone who baked and to Sharon Engstrom who sure knows how to sell a brownie!

Our expenses were higher than normal this year due to hiring the Riley High School Wrestling Team to help us set up the tables, and racks and bring out half of the donations but this saved us much time and energy. We appreciated their work and donated to their team. We also provided lunch this year from Subway for our sale workers on Friday and Saturday – which they appreciated. These expenses took us above the \$250 Action Team funds supplied by Thrivent to support the administrative needs of the sale – otherwise, we would have matched last year's sales.

Our sale is growing in popularity, we estimate about 50-60 shoppers waiting for the doors to open on Friday! While we don't count the number of shoppers, we see many repeat faces from year to year and people tell us they look forward to our sale. The yard signs and sale banner alerted people driving on Ireland Road to the sale, along with Craigslist, Facebook Marketplace, the Coffee News (free advertising), and online with the South Bend Tribune we feel we are making ourselves known and our sales prove this.

While the entire sale is a community outreach project, Saturday is especially of benefit to shoppers because everything is half-price. This means clothing is \$1.00 and we see many shoppers able to purchase multiple clothing items for an exceedingly small expense. We donated selected leftover items to Miller's Vets, St. Margaret's House, Our Lady of the Road, B.A.B.E.S, Resale to the Rescue, and Pet Refuge; items their websites told us they needed. The remaining items were picked up by Goodwill.

Pet Refuge was our main charity this year and will receive \$1391.00 and the Indiana/Kentucky Women of the ELCA will receive \$200.
